



#### Town of Kersey PSA Announcement:

In accordance with the Governor's Stay-At-Home mandate, all Kersey residents are required to follow the guidelines issued by Governor Polis. These requirements include staying within your home or property boundaries and refraining from interaction with others. Certain activities, such as traveling for essential work responsibilities, grocery shopping, medical appointments and caring for vulnerable or disadvantaged family members are expected. We encourage residents to read the Governor's mandate and abide by these regulations in order to help limit potential exposure and defeat the virus outbreak.

There are still essential Town Staff members working around the clock to provide services for the community during this time. Town Hall will remain closed to the public; however, telephone lines will remain open. Please call Town Hall if you have a question about utility bill payments or any other Town services. Utility payments may be made over the phone, dropped off in the 'box' at Town Hall or submitted online: [www.xpressbillpay.com](http://www.xpressbillpay.com). At this point in time, all utility payments are still due on time.

As always, please refrain from using flushable wipes, paper towels, cloth or any other 'non-flushable' materials in home and/or business restroom toilets and drains as these materials could cause major backups and issues within our sewer system.

The Town does have a Continuity of Operations Plan in place as we continue to monitor this ever-changing situation. All upcoming Town Board meetings have been cancelled with the next scheduled assembly set for April 28<sup>th</sup>, unless necessitated otherwise. The Town is researching options for the board to meet electronically while also providing the opportunity for the public to participate.

Town Staff is preparing information that will be distributed shortly regarding local businesses and their operational procedures during this time. We highly encourage residents to shop locally for essential resources during this time as it helps sustain our economy and supports local ownership.

Over the next month we will continue to provide lunch meals for seniors over 60 years. Lunches are served every Tuesday and Thursday between 11:30am-12:30pm. Our Recreation

Staff will be preparing to-go boxes and delivering them to seniors who have called in and reserved meals. If you would like to order a meal for either yourself or a senior adult that meets the 60+ age group, please call the Kersey Community Center at 970-352-8394. Meal orders will go in on Monday and Wednesday morning at 11:30am; please call in before that time to order a meal for the next day's delivery. You will need to leave a message with your name, phone number, quantity of meals and home address for delivery. This meal is provided by the Area Agency on Aging through the Friendly Fork Program; although there is no required fee, the agency does ask for a suggested donation of \$4.00 per meal. Residents are not disqualified for meal service if they cannot donate; the agency wants to feed as many residents as possible without fees being an issue.

All Recreation and Community Center programs have been cancelled through the end of April; we are continually addressing the new challenges facing our programs in the coming days and will make updates as we know more.

As more information becomes available regarding Town regulations during this situation, we will provide updates to the community as quickly and efficiently as possible.
